Sadly, in June we lost the Cat Adoption Room at the Petcetera (*since Oct 2004*). Due to bankruptcy the store had to be closed down. On June 18 we were advised that all of the cats there (24) had to be removed. Thanks very much for the help and support of our foster parents, volunteers and adoptors, the news spread and within 24 hours we were able to find foster or adoptive homes for every one of them!

The problem did not end here. We are now faced with a big problem of placement of cats. Without the Cat Adoption Room we can only rely on foster homes. Never have we been so desperate for foster homes of cats.

I am making an EMERGENCY APPEAL for DONATIONS and FOSTER HOMES for CATS. Can you please HELP?

STEPS OF COMPASSION

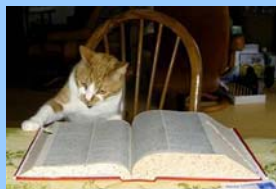
FUR = DEAD ANIMALS

The fur ads you might see in magazines and commercials portray fur coats as a symbol of elegance. But these ads fail to show how the original owners of these coats met their gruesome deaths. Millions of fur-bearing animals including foxes, raccoons, minks, coyotes, bobcats, lynxes, opossums, nutria, beavers, muskrats, otters, and others are killed each year on fur farms by anal and vaginal electrocution and in the wild by drowning, trapping, or beating. **A compassionate lifestyle means wearing cruelty-free clothing – NO FUR please!**

	
Ranch-raised foxes are kept in cages only 2.5 feet square (minks in cages 1-foot-by-3-feet), with up to four animals per cage.	To kill the animals without damaging their fur, trappers usually strangle, beat, or stomp them to death. Animals on fur farms may be gassed, electrocuted, poisoned with strychnine, or have their necks snapped. These methods are not 100 percent effective and some animals "wake up" while being skinned.
	
Every year, thousands of dogs, cats, raptors, and other so-called "trash" animals are crippled or killed by traps.	Animals can languish in traps for days. Up to 1 out of every 4 trapped animals escapes by chewing off his or her own feet, only to die later from blood loss, fever, gangrene, or predation.
